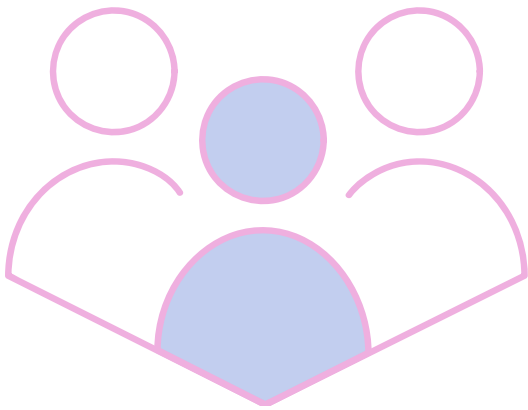


Enhanced Services for Asylees and Vulnerable Noncitizens (ESAVN) Program



WHO ARE WE?

Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Stockton's mission is to advocate for justice and assist those in need by providing help for today and hope for tomorrow.

WHAT IS THE ESAVN PROGRAM?

We provide culturally appropriate and responsive case management services to asylees and vulnerable noncitizens for up to 90 days within the first year following the grant of asylum or vulnerable noncitizens who are deemed eligible for services.

WHO QUALIFIES?

- Individuals who have been recently granted asylum in the last 12 months
- Those who have filed petitions for T-Visa or U-Visa
- Noncitizen victims of human trafficking, domestic violence, and otherserious crimes.

GENERAL CASE MANAGEMENT

We will provide resource navigation and assistance identifying resources.



BENEFITS APPLICATION AID

Medi-Cal, CalFresh and other eligible programs.



SCHOOL ENROLLMENT ASSISTANCE

Assist with gathering information on school enrollment and certifications.



CULTURAL ORIENTATION SUPPORT

Education provided to U.S. newcomers to help them acquire the knowledge, skill, and attitudes needed for cultural adjustment to the U.S.



ENGLISH LANGUAGE DEVELOPMENT

Finding language resources for individuals hoping to learn English.



EMPLOYMENT TRAINING AND ASSISTANCE

Provide guidance finding jobs and navigating local and government job training.
