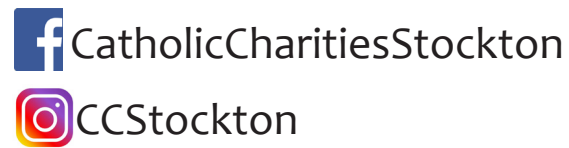

SENIOR SERVICES

Multipurpose Senior Services Program (MSSP)

Provides case management services to the most frail and vulnerable seniors. Arranges in-home services to assist clients with daily needs and teaches them how to live healthier, safer, more active lives, to prevent decline, and to avoid unnecessary hospitalization or nursing home placement.

Title III Caregiver & Homemaker Program

Targets low-income seniors 60 years or older. This program in San Joaquin offers:

- 1) Home Maker Services - light housekeeping
- 2) Personal Care - assistance with bathing and dressing
- 3) Respite Care - relief for the primary caregiver in the home

Our Stanislaus office allows for seniors to remain independent in their own home by providing light house cleaning and companionship.

Homecoming Project

A hospital-to-home service that bridges the gap between a hospital discharge and a strong recovery. It offers care management and services after a patient returns home, to help stabilize and achieve optimal recovery. The care specialist helps the patient secure arrangements to his/her medical appointments, and links the patient to resources related to health and well-being.

Senior Assisted Transportation

Provides adults 60 years or older and those with disabilities with assisted transportation.

SEAPA

Stanislaus Elder Abuse Prevention Alliance provides outreach and advocacy on behalf of seniors and dependent adults.

Ombudsman

Trained, state certified volunteers who work under the guidance of the California State Ombudsman, and advocates for the quality of life and care for residents in skilled nursing homes and residential care homes.

Representative Payee

Assists seniors in paying bills and managing their Social Security and/or Supplemental Security. Income monthly benefits.

Elder Abuse Prevention Program

Elder Abuse Prevention and Mandated Reporting Training offered to those that work with elders in any capacity about elder abuse and how to report suspected abuse.

ADVOCACY

Immigration Legal Services

Low-cost immigration legal services in applying for legal permanent residency status, citizenship application, family reunification, renewal of green cards, filing for employment authorization documents, deferred action for childhood arrivals and applications for temporary protection status.

ESL/Civic Classes

English as a Second Language Civics classes for legal permanent residents committed to becoming US Citizens.

Disaster Care Management Program

Disaster Case Managers provide individualized support in the areas of survivor advocacy, resource and referral services, and recovery planning. The goal of DCMP is to support the survivors in the recovery process by developing an individualized long-term recovery plan.

Enhanced Services for Asylees & Vulnerable Non Citizens (ESAVN)

The ESAVN Program provides appropriate and responsive case management services to asylees and vulnerable noncitizens for up to 90 days within the first year following the grant of asylum or noncitizens deemed eligible for services.

Environmental Justice

Educates and advocates to care for God's creation and people disproportionately impacted by pollution and climate change.

COMMUNITY BENEFITS

Health Care Access

Assists eligible uninsured and under-insured candidates with application, utilization, and retention of Medi-Cal Insurance Program.

Healthy Smiles

Provides oral health care access and preventive health information for children.

CalFresh Healthy Living

Provides food and nutrition education to CalFresh eligible individuals to promote healthy food preparation through demonstration and education.

Food Bank

Provides a temporary solution to hunger by supplying a box/bag of nutritious food for families once a month.

VETFAM - SSVF

Serves homeless veteran families and those at-risk of becoming homeless by providing wrap-around support services.

CalFresh Food

Assists eligible candidates with applications, appeals, and retention of the USDA CalFresh Food program.

Family Wellness

Parent Support

Nurturing parenting is a series of ten independent lessons offered in a 12-week period. Topics include; communicating with respect, building self-worth in children, understanding feelings, ages and stages of growth, etc.

Mentoring for Higher Education

Provides students with case management services, emergency financial aid and technical assistance, as well as connecting students to support programs provided at San Joaquin Delta College.

Family Counseling

Provides preventive and early intervention counseling services (age 55 and older in Sonora, and all ages in Stanislaus and San Joaquin Counties).

Grandparent Support

The program provides home visitation services to grandparents in Lodi, Manteca, and Tracy. During said visits staff trains grandparents on implementing age appropriate developmental screenings along with other activities to promote a healthy development of their grandchildren.

Internships

Catholic Charities administers a clinical internship program and provides training opportunities for master level and post-master licensed eligible clinicians.

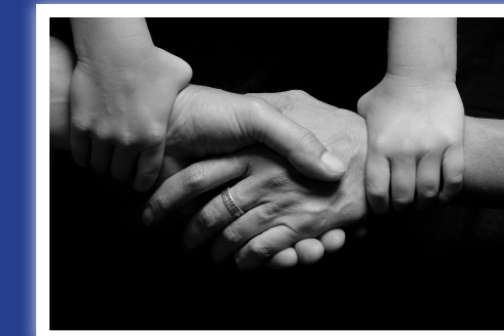
STABILIZING LIVES
